- ✓ Think (advertisers/advertising)

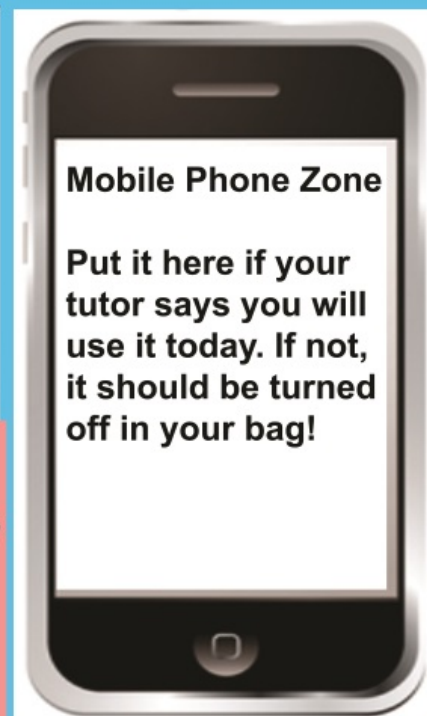
